## How to apply for faculty membership of the CELL Graduate Program

The overall objective of the CELL Graduate Program is to promote and foster a rigorous training in contemporary cell and developmental biology. The Program provides graduate students from diverse backgrounds with a critical understanding of the concepts, scientific fundamentals and methodologies central to cell and developmental biology and provides opportunities for intensive training in specialized aspects of cell and developmental biology through thesis research.

In order to supervise a student in the Program, a faculty member is required to become a member of the Program. Applications for membership of the Program are considered by the Program's Advisory Committee; criteria for acceptance include research background, research accomplishments and ongoing research funding. Acceptance of an individual's application is also contingent upon the applicant agreeing to participate in the various scholarly activities sponsored by the Program which are designed to enhance the training experiences of students registered in the Program. Only in this way is the Program able to take advantage of the expertise of researchers from many different fields and disciplines with the combined interest in cell and developmental biology.
